


Combined PhD/MPsychol application process



- (1) Before submitting a formal application, you must first establish if supervision *within the School* is available by contacting academics whose [research interests](#) coincide with your own. An academic's willingness and ability to supervise is **not** a guarantee of admission.
- (2) Submit your application directly to UNSW using the [Apply Online](#) service, and ensure that you also upload the **compulsory supporting documents** listed below and at Step 3 [here](#), noting there may be an overlap.
 - a. A completed [Supplementary Application Form](#)
 - b. A complete and official academic transcript for your accredited [three-year sequence in psychology](#)
 - c. A complete and official academic transcript (*if complete*), or evidence of **current enrolment** (*if incomplete*) for your accredited [Honours/fourth year in psychology](#)
 - d. A copy of your CV
 - e. A copy of your APS assessment letter (**international psychology qualifications only**)
- (3) Refer to the [School's website](#) for information about submitting references.
- (4) The [Graduate Research School \(GRS\)](#) will acknowledge receipt of your application and provide you with a UNSW Student ID. Applications with all relevant compulsory supporting documents will be sent to the School for further assessment. Applications that are missing documents will be put on hold until the documents are submitted.
- (5) The School will determine if you meet the minimum entry requirements for your program.
 - a. **Requirements met:** The School will contact you if only one, or neither, of your references have been submitted. Your application will not be considered further until **both** references have been submitted.
 - b. **Requirements not met:** The School will advise the GRS that your application was unsuccessful. The GRS will email formal confirmation of this to you.

- (6) Once the application deadline passes, each program's Selection Committee will finalise their shortlist.
- (7) Shortlisted applicants will be invited to participate in an interview (Clinical) or an Assessment Centre (Forensic) in late November/early December. The Forensic Assessment Centre **must** be attended **in person**, and in 2017 will run on Wednesday, 6 December and Thursday, 7 December.
- (8) The School will ask the GRS to send formal offers to successful interviewees. Offers are to be accepted online and cannot be deferred. The School aims to finalise places for each program before the University shuts down for the year.

NOTE: Applicants considering admission to *both* a Combined degree *and* a stand-alone Master degree must submit two applications—one for the Master (coursework) degree, and one for the Combined (research) degree. This is important, as different units of the University are responsible for the assessment of each application type.
