The program consists of 192 units of credit (uoc) across four stages (years). In each stage there are 48 uoc or 24 in each of two sessions.

① Arts and Social Science courses include Australian Studies (AUST), Chinese (CHIN), Comparative Development (COMD), Education (EDST), English (ENGL), European Studies (EURO), French (FREN), German (GERS), Modern Greek (GREK), History (HIST), Indonesian (INDO), Italian (ITAL), Japanese (JAPN), Jewish Studies (JWST), Korean (KORE), Latin (LATN), Linguistics (LING), Media, Film and Theatre (MEFT), Music and Music Education (MUSC), Politics and International Relations (POLS), Russian (RUSS), Social Science and Policy (SLSP), Sociology and Anthropology (SOCA), Spanish and Latin American Studies (SPAN), and Womens Studies (WOMS).

② Science courses include Aviation (AVIA), Biology (BABS/BIOS), Biotechnology (BIOT), Chemistry (CHEM), Computer Science (COMP), Food Technology (FOOD), Geography /Geoscience (GEOS), History and Philosophy of Science (HPSC), Mathematics (MATH), Philosophy (PHIL), Physics (PHYS), Safety Science (SESC), Science Communication (SCOM), and Vision Science (VISN).

③ Business courses include Accounting (ACCT), Economics (ECON), Economic History (ECON), Finance (FINS), Information Systems (INFS), Business Law and Taxation (LEGT), Marketing (MARK), and Organisation and Management (MGMT).
